## **Project Details and Financial Breakdown**

With the money allocated to him, Naboth bought a 1/4 acre piece of land (\$60) 25 pockets of potato seed(\$255) and hired transportation to and fro town(\$50). He is yet to buy the necessary bags of fertilizer and hire a tractor to clear the land once the rains are less heavier.

From the \$800 he is looking to get an average of \$2500 after harvesting, 3 months from planting.

### **Project Details and Financial Breakdown**

From the grant Isaac was given he managed to acquire a hatchery incubator (\$870), 50 extra layer birds (\$400) and cages and installments (\$300). With the layer chicks he makes an average profit of \$40 a month but believes if he can manage to have 500 birds at a time, thats when a significant profit can be realized. His hatchery currently has 520 chicks but if he could acquire a 1000 chick incubator, he could realize a good profit.

His overall target is to make about \$70,000 over a period of 2 years and complete his family home.

# **Project Details and Financial Breakdown**

Morgan has 25,000 bricks at the moment that are ready to be sold and his designated digging pits still have enough soil to make several hundred thousand bricks.

He puts in about \$600 for every 10,000 bricks and makes a profit of about \$300 per batch. However the bigger batches he can make the better the profit that is realized so he is hoping to be in a financial position to make bigger batches and supply.

### **Project Details and Financial Breakdown**

John already had an ongoing poultry project when he received the grant so all of the provided funds went to chicken mash for both layers and broilers. The 200 layers are now at laying stage and the 180 broilers are also just about ready for the slaughter.

He is yet to start selling his produce and calculate the profit but his intention is to raise \$100,000 in a 5 year period to fulfill his personal vision.

If he has enough funds at his disposal he would like to increase the quantity of his chickens to 500 layers and 500 broilers as his project area has potential to increase the project size.
